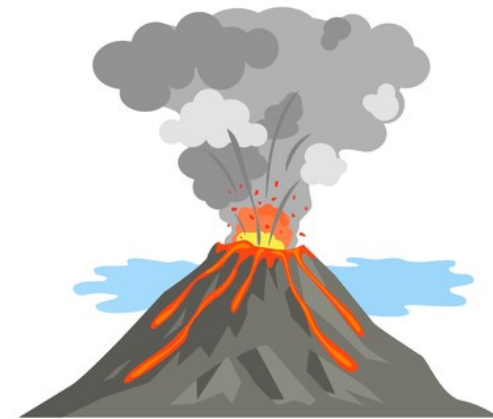

Welcome to our Spring term 1

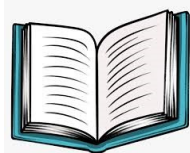
School will be a little different this term, but this does not mean that it will be any less wonderful or exciting. Year 4 expectations

Children who are remote learning must complete the work that they are set and send a copy to school, preferably over email, so that teachers can send the required feedback. Paper packs can be created on request, to ensure each child makes progress towards their end of year expectations.

Reading is crucial to a child's development and, as well as reading 5 times per week, it is expected that children write in their own journals about what they have been reading. When completing a book at home, it would be wonderful if children could write a book review and send it to Mrs Oliver. It will also be great to discuss your reading with you when we call you during the week.



Within Our Class

Our topic this term is 'Rocks, Relics and Rumbles'. This is an exciting topic in which we will be learning more about our amazing planet including earthquakes, volcanoes and plate tectonics.

Our **English** lessons this term will focus on writing to persuade. We will begin by looking at different tv adverts to create our own success criteria before creating our own persuasive adverts. We will then continue persuasive writing, focussing on letter writing.

Within **Maths** this term we will continue to use White Rose and our focus will be on multiplication and division. We will be starting to use written methods to multiply 2 and 3 digit numbers by 1 digit numbers, before moving on to divide 2 digit numbers by 1 digit numbers.

Knowing the times tables supports mathematical learning and understanding and those children who have a strong grasp of them tend to be more self-assured when learning new concepts. To assist in this, children have access to the fantastic resource **Times Tables Rockstars**. This is a fun and challenging programme designed to help pupils master the times tables. To be a Times Table Rock Star you need to answer any multiplication fact up to 12×12 in less than 3 seconds! All children have their own usernames and passwords.
