

INDIGENOUS PEOPLES OF THE ARCTIC



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- The word indigenous means ‘originating or occurring naturally in a particularly place; native.’
- Indigenous people are native to that location, they were born and raised there and it is *‘their land*.
- Approximately 4 million people live in the Arctic region, with only 10% of those being indigenous. The remaining 90% are immigrants that have moved to this location.
