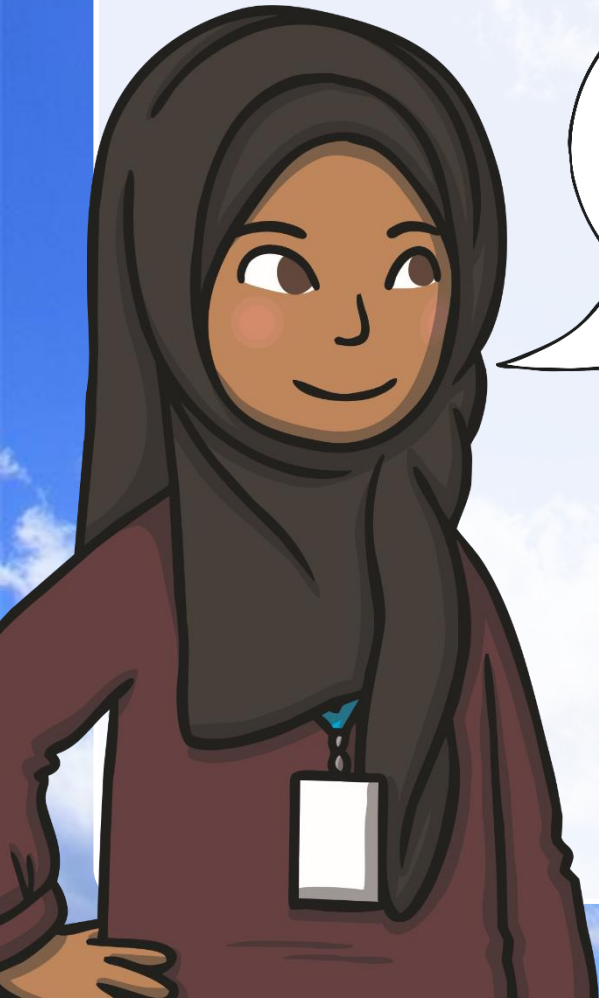

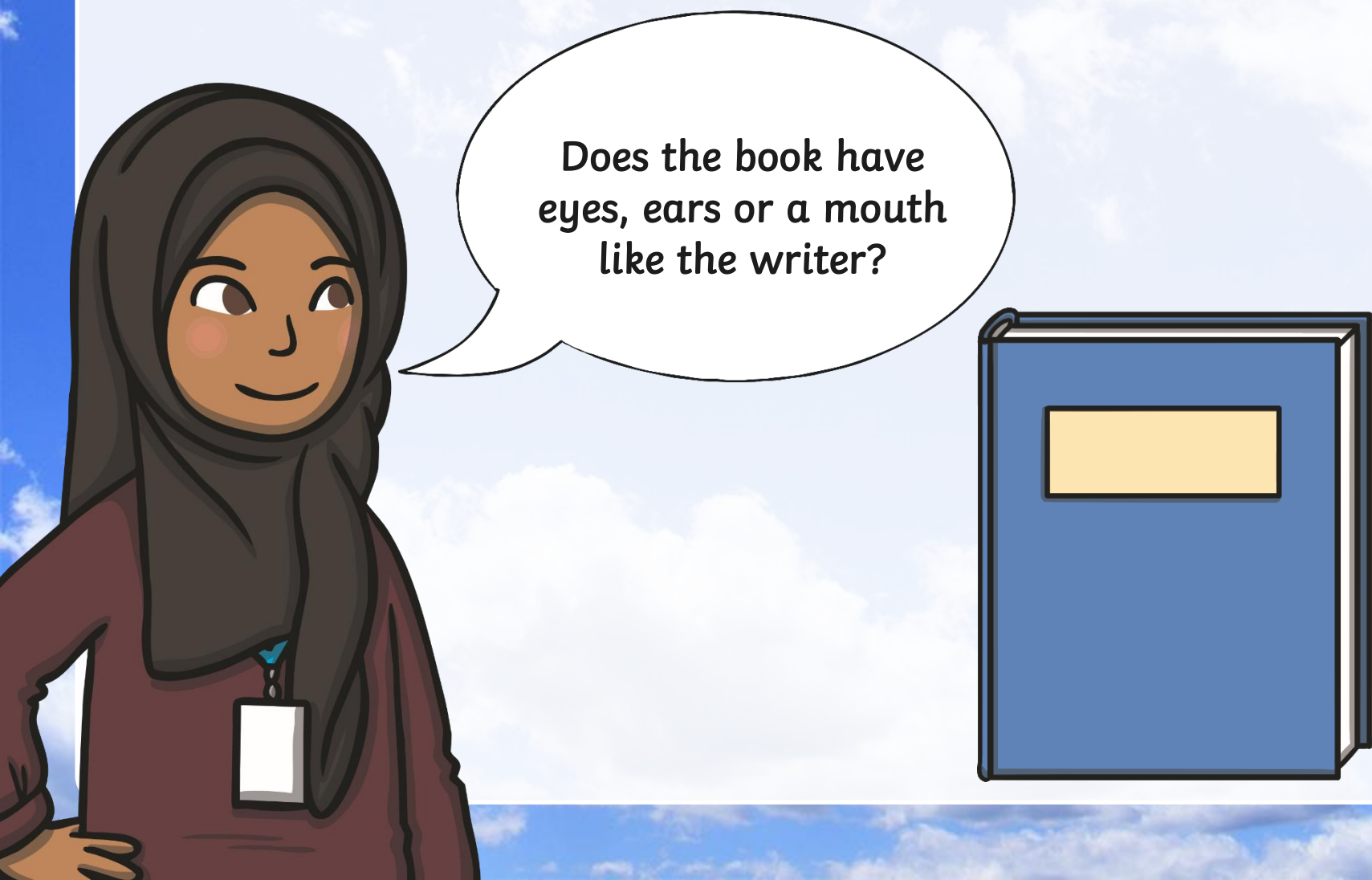

So what do Muslims believe.....

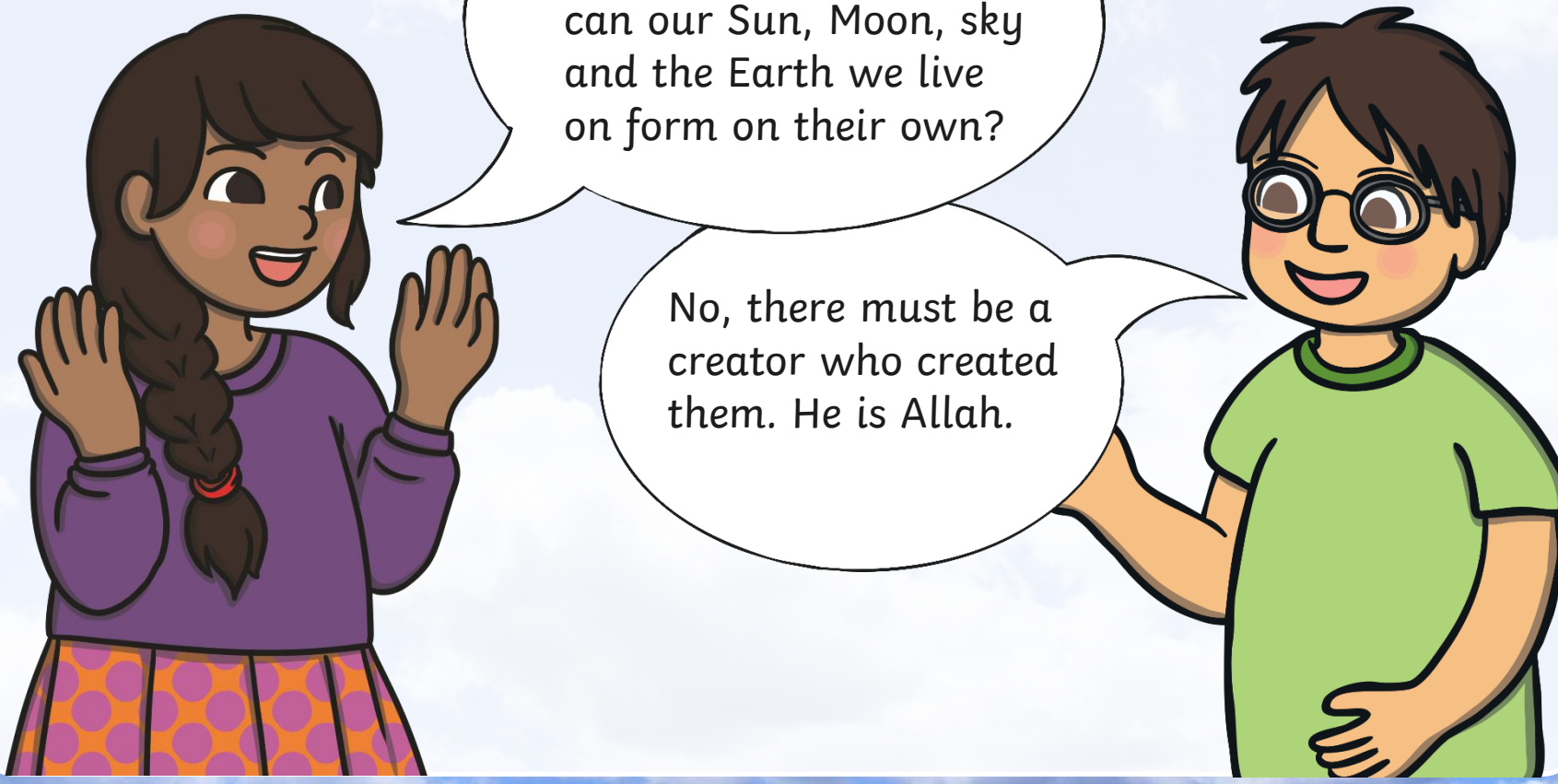
Allah Is Unique

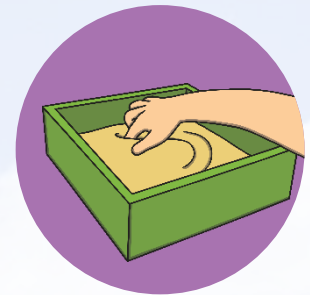

Five Facts Muslims believe about Allah



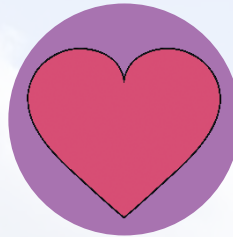
Allah is our One true God.
