Expectations for Summer Term

We have all achieved so much already whilst in Year 3 and we cannot wait to see this continue! With this in mind, please find a reminder of some of the expectations within Year 3.

Reading is extremely important and helps children to develop their imagination, writing and spelling. To help this grow, children need to be reading at least five times a week and making an entry into their reading journal every time. When the children are ready to change their books, they need to tell an adult in school. The children will then be able to change their own books once they have read them to an adult.

Lots of children are utilising the access to Nessler that they have and we won the Nessler certificate twice last term! This is great because Nessler is a fun, independent way for the children to practice their reading and spelling. I wonder how many certificates we will win this term?

Times tables are incredibly important within the vast majority of maths and as a result, it is vital that children are practicing them! A great way to do this is with TTRockstars which everyone still has an account for and the people who spend the most time practicing will win a special TTRockstars prize!

Within Our Class

Our topic for this term is Blue Abyss. During this topic we will be learning all about the world's oceans and seas, what pollution is and how we can help, oceanography, environmental issues related to oceans and The Great Barrier Reef. We will be starting our topic off with our WOW Day where we will be researching ocean animals, sketching them and creating sculptures out of clay. We will also be going on a walk to the local river to explore and identify any evidence we can find of pollution.

During this term's English lessons we will be focusing on writing to inform. Within this we will be writing a newspaper report about pollution and a diary entry.

Within Maths this term we will be using White Rose and we will be focussing on the properties of shapes, mass and capacity and multiplication and division.

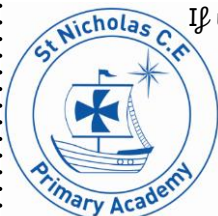
