Capital Letters and punctuation.

The first aspect that we are going to be checking is our capital letters and punctuation.

Remember... all of your sentences need a capital letter and a piece of punctuation at the end. Names also need a capital letter.

M B
~~mr~~ booth I don't think you should build the volcano on our school field.



Spelling

This aspect will help us to really focus on our spelling.

Whilst you are reading your letter out loud, really focus on each word to see if you have spelt them right.

If you find a word that you have not spelt correctly then we need to have a look at it. To do this you can..

- use your phonic knowledge to sound out the word
- Use a dictionary
