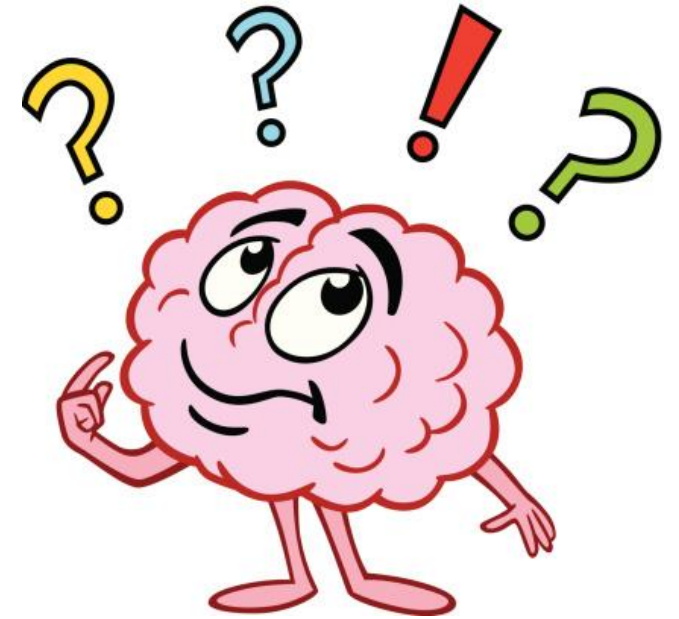

Think carefully about what you need to include in your third paragraph. Remember, we are writing to persuade.

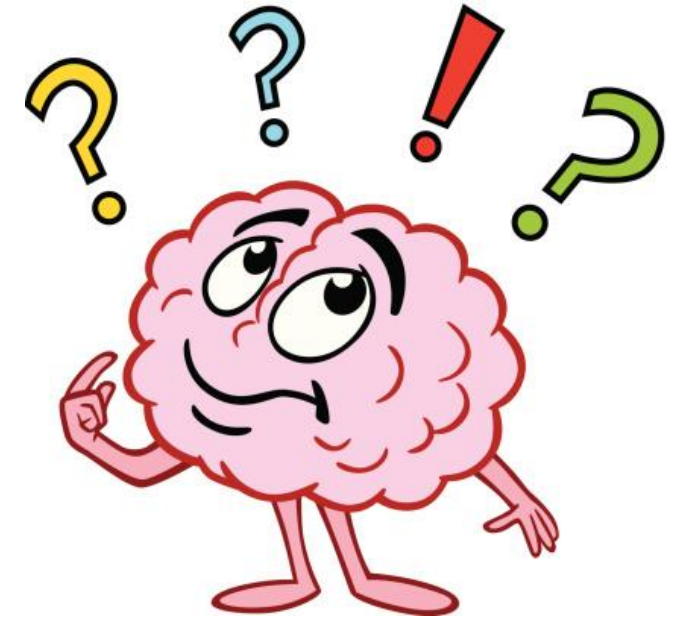
