Of the many hungry dinosaurs.

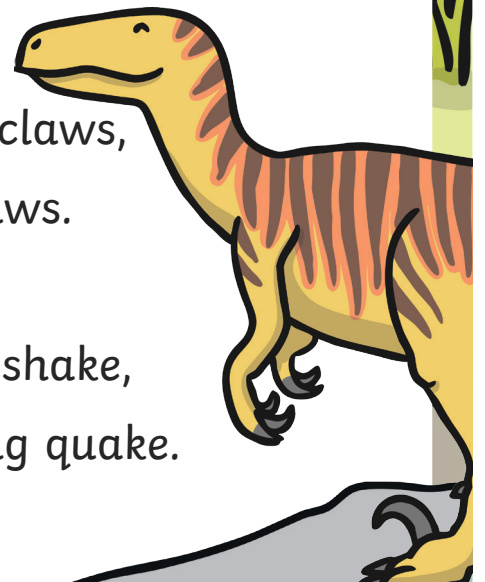
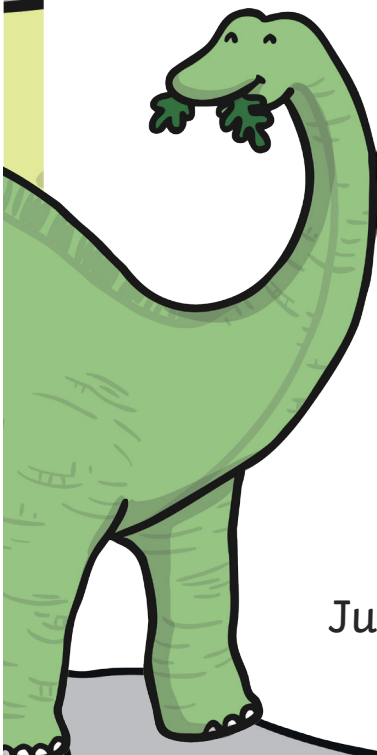
Screech! Screech! Came the sound,
