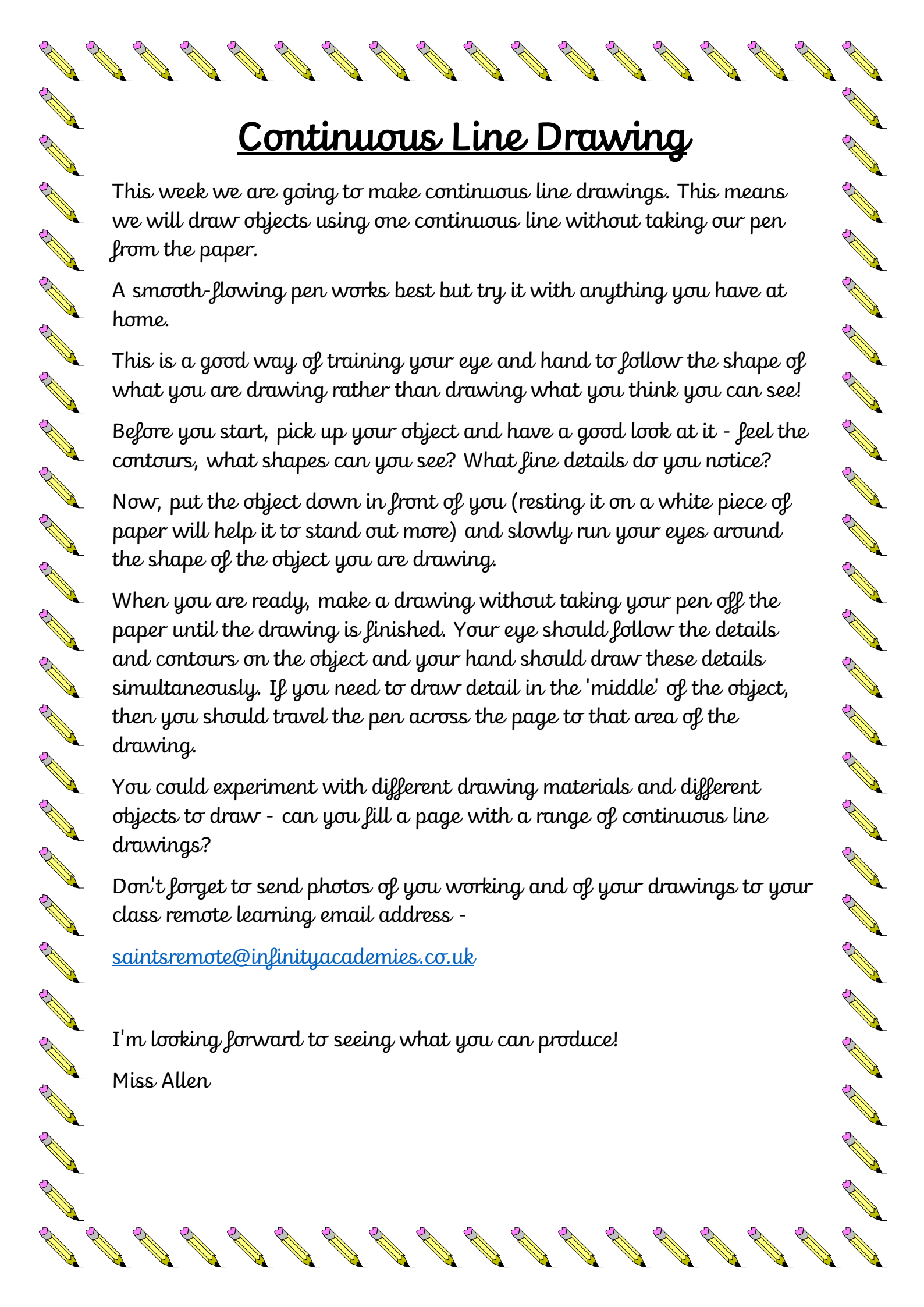




Continuous Line Drawing

This week we are going to make continuous line drawings. This means we will draw objects using one continuous line without taking our pen from the paper.

A smooth-flowing pen works best but try it with anything you have at home.

This is a good way of training your eye and hand to follow the shape of what you are drawing rather than drawing what you think you can see!

Before you start, pick up your object and have a good look at it - feel the contours, what shapes can you see? What fine details do you notice?

Now, put the object down in front of you (resting it on a white piece of paper will help it to stand out more) and slowly run your eyes around the shape of the object you are drawing.

When you are ready, make a drawing without taking your pen off the paper until the drawing is finished. Your eye should follow the details and contours on the object and your hand should draw these details simultaneously. If you need to draw detail in the 'middle' of the object, then you should travel the pen across the page to that area of the drawing.

You could experiment with different drawing materials and different objects to draw - can you fill a page with a range of continuous line drawings?
