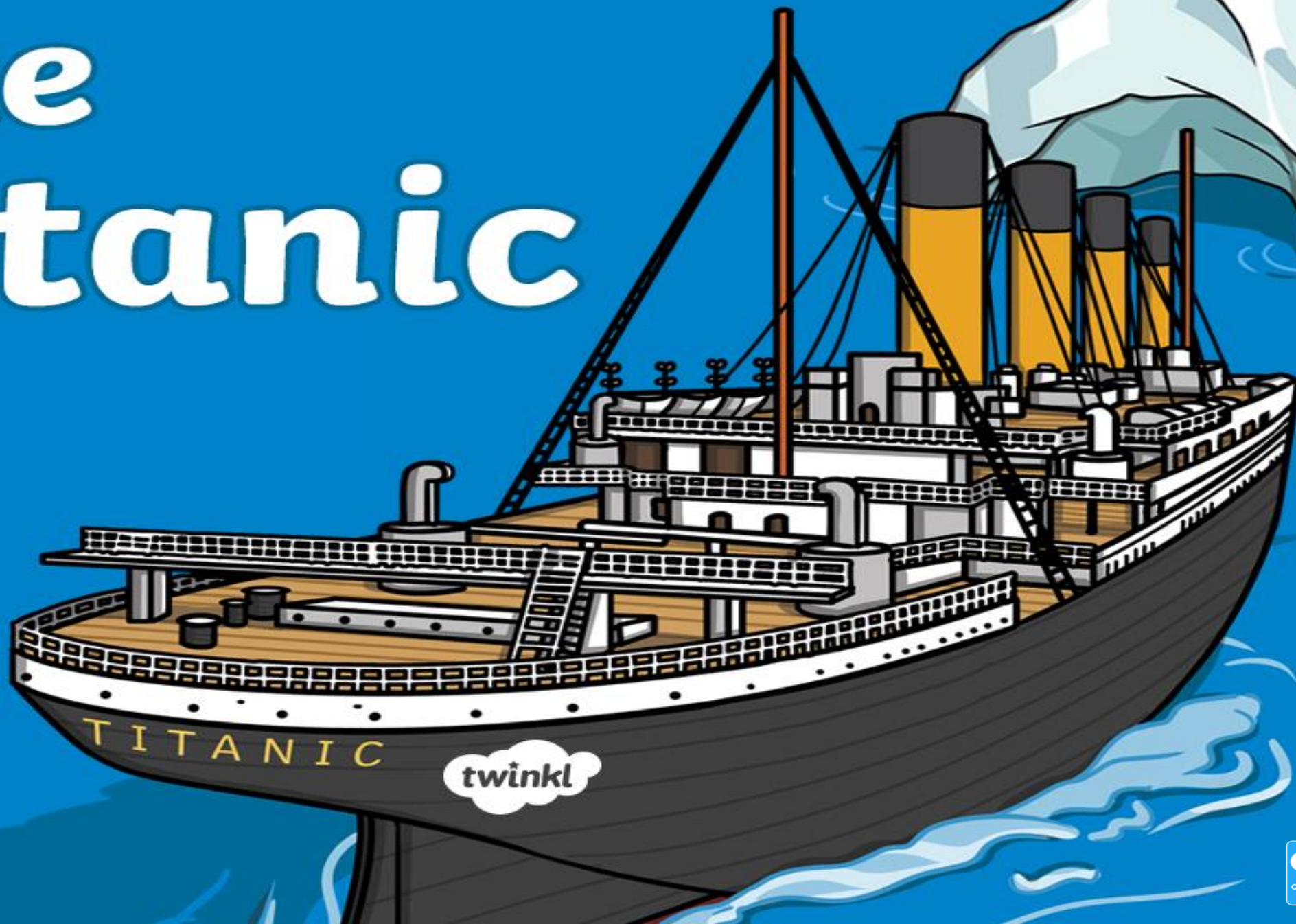

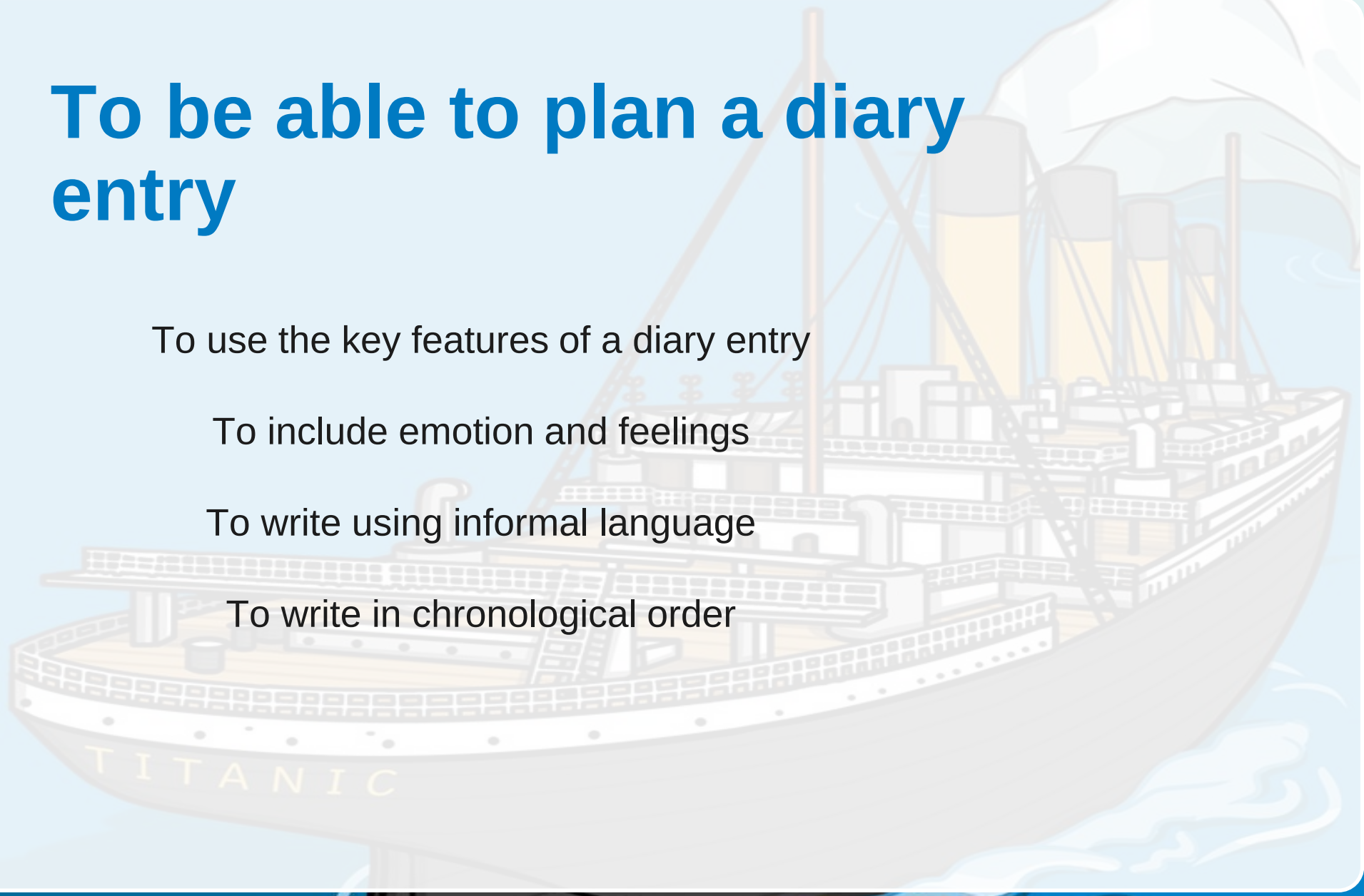

10th April 1912

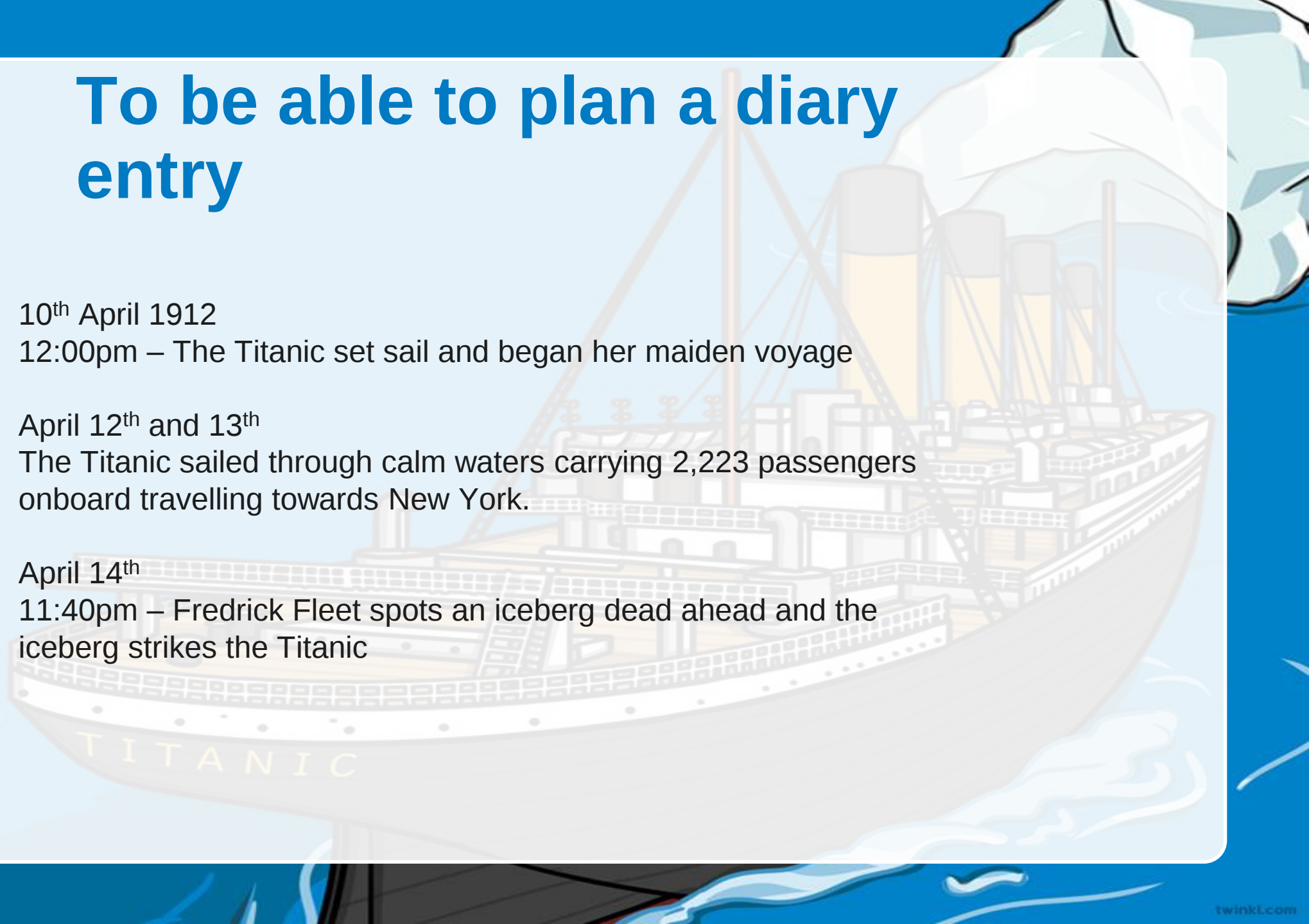
12:00pm – The Titanic set sail and began her maiden voyage

April 12th and 13th

The Titanic sailed through calm waters carrying 2,223 passengers onboard travelling towards New York.

April 14th

11:40pm – Fredrick Fleet spots an iceberg dead ahead and the iceberg strikes the Titanic



To be able to plan a diary entry

April 15th

12:00am – The captain was told the ship would only stay afloat for a couple of hours

12:05am - The orders was given to uncover the lifeboats and to get passengers and crew ready on deck. There was only room in the lifeboats for half of the estimated 2,223 on board

12:25am – The lifeboats begin to be boarded by women and children. The Carpathia received a distress call and started to travel to their rescue.

12:45am – The first lifeboat was safely released with only 28 of the 65 seats full.

2:05am – The last lifeboat was safely released from the ship with 1,500 people still onboard.

2:17am – The last radio signal was sent from the Titanic

2:20am - The Titanic's broken off stern settled back into the water, becoming more level for a few moments. Slowly it filled with water and tilted its end high into the air before sinking into the sea. People in the water slowly froze to death.

4:10am - The first lifeboat was picked up by the Carpathia.
