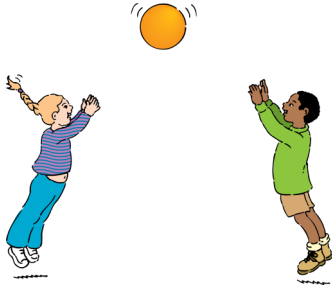


P.E.

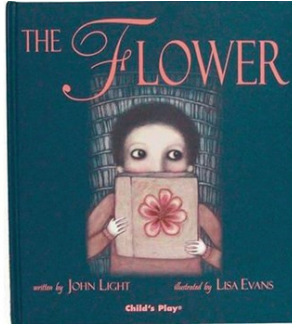

Our Class Reading Book This Term Is ...

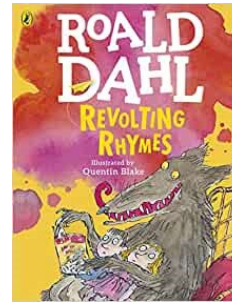

Science—Our Changing World



This term we will continue to care for and nurture all the different plants that we planted last term. We will carefully observe the changes that happen throughout the term on weekly visits to our allotment area. We will build

upon our learning throughout the year by looking at habitats again and how the animals change over time. We will focus on comparing adult animals to their young.

Primary Engineer Lighthouse Project

We have been given an exciting engineering project to complete this term which involves using shoe boxes to construct a truck to a given specification. The truck will replicate the importance of delivering materials to a lighthouse building site. The vehicle will be required to travel down a ramp in a straight line for as long a distance as possible. It must also incorporate a tilting payload area and a warning hazard, flashing light!

Maths

Key Learning: Fractions

- Recognise, find, name and write fractions, one third, one quarter, two quarters and three quarters of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity
- Write simple fractions for example, one half of 6 = 3 and recognise the equivalence of two quarters and one half.

Key Learning: Time

- Compare and sequence intervals of time
- Tell and write the time to five minutes, including quarter past/to the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times

Key Learning: Problem Solving

- Solve simple problems in a practical context involving addition and subtraction of money of the same unit, including giving change
- Use place value and number facts to solve problems
- Recognise and use the inverse relationship between addition and subtraction and use this to check calculations and solve missing number problems.
- Solve problems involving multiplication and division, using materials, arrays, repeated addition, mental methods, and multiplication and division facts, including problems in contexts
