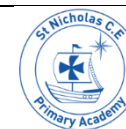




Noahs Ark Class Week Commencing 27/04/20

Keeping Active	Being Creative	Family Time

Do each action for each letter. Try with other words.	Transient Art – collect items from in and around your home. It could be cans, food, sticks, stones, clothes etc. Arrange them on a blanket to make your own unique art work. Rearrange to create something new. See ‘resources’ for ideas.	Can you help make your dinner or tea? Maybe you could butter the bread or help to chop up the vegetables, making sure you are using the equipment safely and with an adult. Play ‘I Spy’ – using colours and shapes as an alternative to letters.
RE and Mindfulness	English	Maths
This terms value is Perseverance. See the resources section for the story and rhyme of Noah’s Ark. Create your own glitter jar – see the resources section for instructions. If you want a few minutes to reflect sit somewhere quiet and shake your glitter jar, concentrate on the movements in the bottle. Check out Mrs Tory glitter bottle video. I used foil, glitter and pom poms.	Use different resources to practice your letter formation. In sand, salt or maybe in mud. See the St Nicholas website ‘children’ then ‘video resource centre’ for Mrs Tory’s guidance. ‘Match the caption’ game. See the captions in the ‘resources section’. Reading	Phonics and Spelling	Topic
Look in the resources section to read the story of the Gingerbread Man with an adult or listen to Mrs Tory on the St Nicholas website, go to ‘children’ and then ‘video resource centre’. Can you remember the different animals in the story? Maybe draw a picture and write about each one. What did the Gingerbread Man say when he ran away?	This week we will be learning the new trigraphs ‘ear’ and ‘air’. See the resources section for activities and the ‘video resource centre’ for Mrs Tory’s flashcards. See the resources section for the ‘tricky word’ song. Ask an adult to say some of the ‘tricky words’. Can you write them?	Can you read me a story? Our new topic is looking at lots of traditional stories. Read, or listen to Mrs Tory read The Gingerbread Man story in the ‘video resource centre’ and then see the resources section for a variety of activities.
