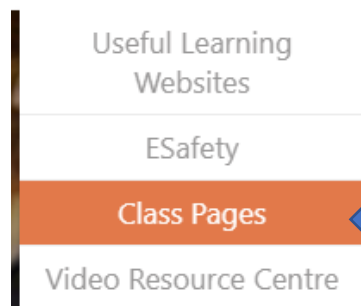

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3) Select your child's class:

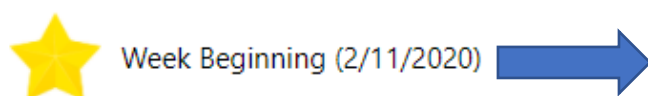


4) Once you are in your child's class page, select the 'Remote Learning' tab which looks like this:

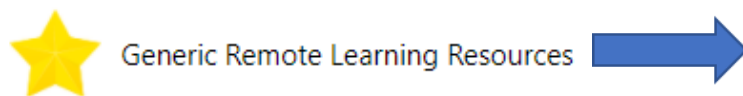


5) The first thing you will see is an example timetable for their Class which you may like to use as a helpful guide to structuring your child's week whilst they are learning remotely.

6) Under the timetable, you will see the following icons:



By selecting this tab, you will find all of the resources your child needs in order to complete the remote tasks in: English, Maths, Topic, RE & Wellbeing for the corresponding date.



The Generic Learning Resources tab is a selection of more general learning links that may enhance your child's remote learning – you can explore this at your leisure!

7) Your child should work their way through the set tasks by using the PowerPoints, videos, teaching slides and additional links provided within the weekly tab.

8) Work can be emailed to your child's class teacher using the email address shown on their remote learning tab so that individual feedback & development points can be provided. Your child's class teacher will give you details about when they will be checking their emails and when you can expect your child's feedback to arrive (they may still be teaching in school every day as well as providing remote learning opportunities – so please be patient with them!)

For every week/ day that your child is learning remotely (or self-isolating but not ill), you can expect the following to be provided for them so that disruption to their learning is kept to a minimum:

DAILY
1 x English task (usually Writing focussed)
1 x Maths task
General daily activities:
Times table practise using TT Rockstars
Phonics or Spelling practise (depending on need)
Wellbeing activity (usually PE/ active)
Continue to read LOTS of books

WEEKLY
3 x Reading tasks
1 x Topic task (Art/ DT/ Music/ History/ Geography)
1 x RE Task
1 x Science
1 x PSHCE (Personal, Social, Health & Citizenship Education)



Many of the resources used for remote learning will be from 'Twinkl', which is a teaching resource centre where school staff can access a broad range of wonderful resources to help them deliver the National Curriculum content in a fun, child-friendly way. Class Teachers and Teaching Assistants will adapt these resources so that they are bespoke to the curriculum being delivered in your child's class. By adapting them, Class Teachers and Teaching Assistants also ensure your child's needs are being met so they can make good progress towards their end of year expectations.

Class Teachers and Teaching Assistants will also compile remote learning opportunities from a range of other external providers which may be electronic links, videos, teacher-made videos or simply a good old-fashioned quiz! You may see remote learning tasks come from some of the following places:



If your family/ child does not have access to an electronic device at home, please speak to school as soon as possible so that an alternative can be arranged.



Home Learning (previously known as Home 'work') which will be set in every class every week regardless of Covid:

Your child will have their Remote Learning Pack at home which will have the following items in it:

- CGP Catch up books
- Exercise book to write in
- Pencil

The CGP books your child will receive are:

- ✓ a grammar, punctuation and spelling book
- ✓ a targeted maths book
- ✓ a comprehension book

Each week, this pack will be used to complete the home learning tasks which will be based around the CGP Catch-up materials. There will be one activity to be completed in each book, every week.

PLEASE DO NOT ALLOW YOUR CHILD TO COMPLETE ANYTHING OTHER THAN THE TASKS THEY HAVE BEEN GIVEN BY THEIR TEACHER because learning in these books will mirror the learning in school. All children who have been at school that week, will be able to use their knowledge, skills and understanding to access it.

A **Parent Hub message** will be sent each week from your child's class teacher with details about what content to complete. Home learning will be **set on a Thursday** and will be **due in the following Tuesday** so that it can be marked and your child can be given feedback on it where necessary.

All these books will need returning to school, still inside the plastic wallet, on Tuesday mornings, ready to be marked/feedback given where needed and home learning reset for Thursday.

In the event of self-isolation where your child continues to be well, these books will still be expected to be completed as part of our remote learning package.

Should a class or bubble close (or if your child has to isolate but continues to be well) this pack will stay at home so that remote learning activities can be completed using the resources within it.

In the event that self-isolation starts while the CGP books are in school being marked, these books will need collecting from the school after school on Thursday or during the day on Friday **if it is safe to do so**.
