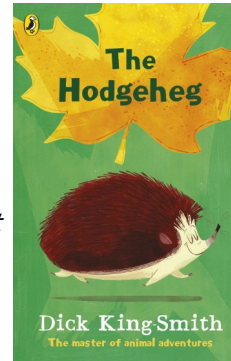
This term our Collective Worship theme is:

Our topic this term is called 'Wriggle and Crawl'

The children will grab their coats and pooters – they're going out and about on a minibeast hunt! They will dig holes and lift up logs to see who's home.

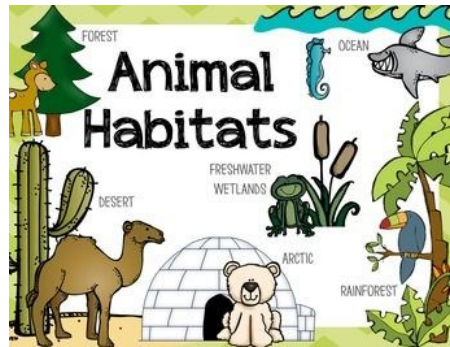

Science

Living things and their habitats



This term we will be learning to explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead and things that have never been alive. We will also identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants and how they depend on each other.



Maths

Key Learning: Length and height

- Choose and use appropriate standard units to estimate and measure length/height in any direction: to the nearest appropriate unit, using rulers.
- Compare and order lengths, and record the results using $>$, $<$ and $=$

Key Learning: Problem Solving

- Solve simple problems in a practical context involving addition and subtraction of money of the same unit, including giving change
- Use place value and number facts to solve problems
- Recognise and use the inverse relationship between addition and subtraction and use this to check calculations and solve missing number problems
- Solve problems involving multiplication and division

Key Learning: Position and Direction

- Order and arrange combinations of objects in patterns and sequences
- Use mathematical vocabulary to describe position, direction and movement, including quarter, half and three-quarter turns (clockwise and anti-clockwise)
